BOARD BRIEFS

SOLICITATIONS

Our prohibition on door-to-door canvassing does not apply to visits by candidates for public office. By law, the candidate may personally call at our homes to meet us and present literature soliciting support. Agents of candidates are not afforded that courtesy and should be advised to leave the Myrtle Trace Properties. We can expect that our reputation for political awareness and voting participation will attract the candidates throughout the next several months.

VOTING AT THE CLUBHOUSE

Regularly scheduled events will be suspended on June 10th and June 24th and the evenings preceding those dates in order to set up equipment and conduct election activities. You are encouraged to exercise your right to vote and help others from this precinct, which includes the Burning Ridge community, to find their way for that purpose. After voting, please be mindful that exiting vehicles are expected to use the circle to establish a departing traffic pattern.

STATUS OF ROADWAYS

Although our suit to “close the roads” has not yet been placed on a court calendar, and there is nothing noteworthy on that process, we can report that the County has repaired Myrtle Trace Drive between Cricket Court and Berry Tree Lane. The County continues to meet its obligations while the legal issues remain unresolved.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

At our May meeting it was reported that \$3,000.00 was taken from a work van. The van was not locked. It was reported to the police. This is a good lesson on not leaving valuables in your vehicles unlocked. We have had the neighborhood watch patrols over two months now. We have received very favorable comments from the Myrtle Trace residents. The patrols go out at random times so they don't set a pattern. Patrols are not a 100% surefire but it helps. It is our hope that burglars see our signs on the Neighborhood Watch vehicles and know we are watching.

If you have a problem at your home and feel threatened, call 911 and the police will respond. If you have a situation, such as a strange car driving by your home on a regular basis, call the police non-emergency telephone number, 248-1520. If you can get the license plate number, make of vehicle and color, it will help the police.

We have a very dedicated group of volunteers who give up their time to help keep Myrtle Trace safe. There are fourteen Myrtle Tracers on this committee. We are looking for more volunteers to fill vacation time for our drivers. Call Jack Von Deck 234-2763 if you are interested.

All residents should watch for garage doors being left open in the evening. Call your neighbors and make them aware of this. I'm sure they will thank you. It's neighbors watching out for neighbors. If we all work together it will help maintain Myrtle Trace as the fine community we all love.
