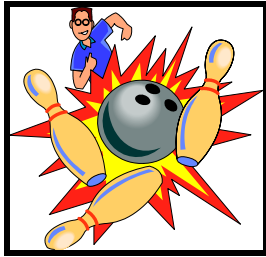

There are no areas within Myrtle Trace where picking up is not required.

### THIRD QUARTER TREASURER'S REPORT

Our actual net operating income for the first nine months of 2010 was \$27,624.89 or \$7,681.61 less than our budgeted amount of \$35,306.50. This deficit reflected the impact of the unbudgeted expenditures necessary to remedy the sinkhole problem and pipe replacement on Myrtle Trace Drive and the well pump, motor and control box replacement on Lake Heron.

Our Balance Sheet remains relatively unchanged as we enter the last quarter of the year.

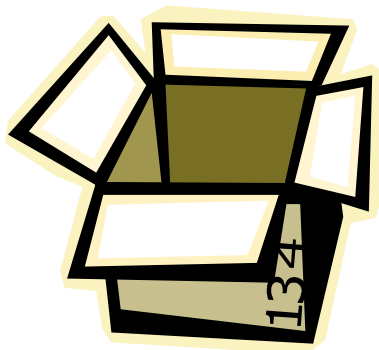
# HELP!

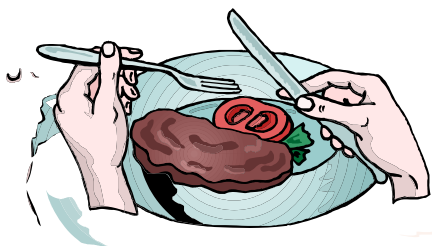

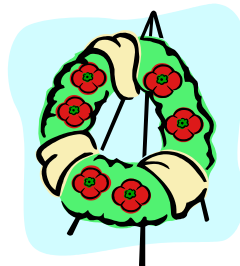
